



The NAA Arborist School events are provided to assist arborists and horticulture professionals in:


- increasing their knowledge of plant characteristics important to tree identification

Tree ID, Evaluation & Selection, Planting & Establishment

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Understand plant characteristics that are important to identification.
- Understand plant classification structure and nomenclature as it relates to appropriate tree selection and anticipated tree characteristics and limitations.
- Identify the various benefits and limitations of common landscape trees.
- Distinguish between deciduous and evergreen trees and understand their appropriate uses.
- Identify a wide variety of native and adapted trees commonly found in Nebraska landscapes.
- Understand the concepts of provenance and hardiness as they affect tree selection and health.
- Understand the importance of species and temporal diversity in the urban forest.
- Understand the concept of "right tree in the right place."
- Identify and understand the impact of environmental, soil, and other conditions on tree establishment and growth.
- Understand proper planting and maintenance practices.
- Understand site considerations, cultural management techniques, and overall plant health care.
- Understand basic tree selection, installation and establishment.

Registration fee for Tree ID includes: "What Tree is This?" book, handouts & field study sheets. Morning snack & lunch is included in registration fees for all events.



Pruning, Climbing & Safety

This class is designed for beginning arborists. The class will instruct on pruning, safety, knots, and climbing and will cater to the individual needs of attendees. Pruning instruction will include significant hands on practice for attendees. Climbing instruction will also include how to safely maneuver around in trees.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Understand the basic concepts of climbing.
- Identify and safely utilize tree climbing equipment
- Identify and utilize the proper knot for a specific application.
- Identify specialized tree maintenance practices such as cabling and bracing.
- Understand tree physiology and the effects of pruning.
- Identify and understand decay and risk assessment of trees.
- Identify various types of pruning cuts and their respective application(s).
- Identify and understand the safety aspects of chain saws, working around electrical wires, traffic control, and other work site issues.
- Understand aspects of aerial rescue.
- Understand the importance of employee training and establishment of a job work plan.
- Understand safety & ANSI Standards.

Registration fee for Pruning, Climbing & Safety includes: "The Tree Climbers Companion" book & the "TCIA Pocket Guide PPE Selection, Use & Care" book.

Recommended Materials: Hard hat, ANSI z87 safety glasses, boots, and gloves.

Optional but Encouraged: Tree climbing harness, climbing rope, work positioning lanyard, throw line, and throw bag. NAA will have some equipment available for student use.

Note: All personal protective equipment (PPE) and climbing gear will be inspected prior to use and must meet current industry standards.

Morning snack & lunch is included in registration fees for all events.





The class is an introductory class covering tree biology, soils, fertilization and nutrition, insect, and diseases common to trees in our area. It provides in-depth training for those who are considering arborist certification or want to learn more about trees and tree care in general. The seminar is designed to specifically prepare students for certain areas of the NAA Certification Exam. Offered only once per year, it is the most comprehensive tool available to arborists.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Understand tree biology.
- Identify and understand common insects and diseases of trees.
- Identify and understand the cause of common tree symptoms (i.e. diagnose tree disorders).
- Understand urban soils and their relationship with tree biology, establishment, and maintenance.
- Identify and understand nutrients and fertilizers and their relationship to tree function.
- Understand tree support and protection systems.
- Understand construction impacts to trees.
- Understand tree assessment and risk management.

Registration fee for Plant Health & Tree Biology class includes: ISA Arborists' Certification Study Guide, NAA certification study guide guestions, Common Insect Pests, Diseases and Abiotic Problems of Trees brochures, NAA certification exam (Certification fee not included), 1 year subsidized NAA membership (offered to non-members only) Morning snack & lunch is included in registration fees for all events.
